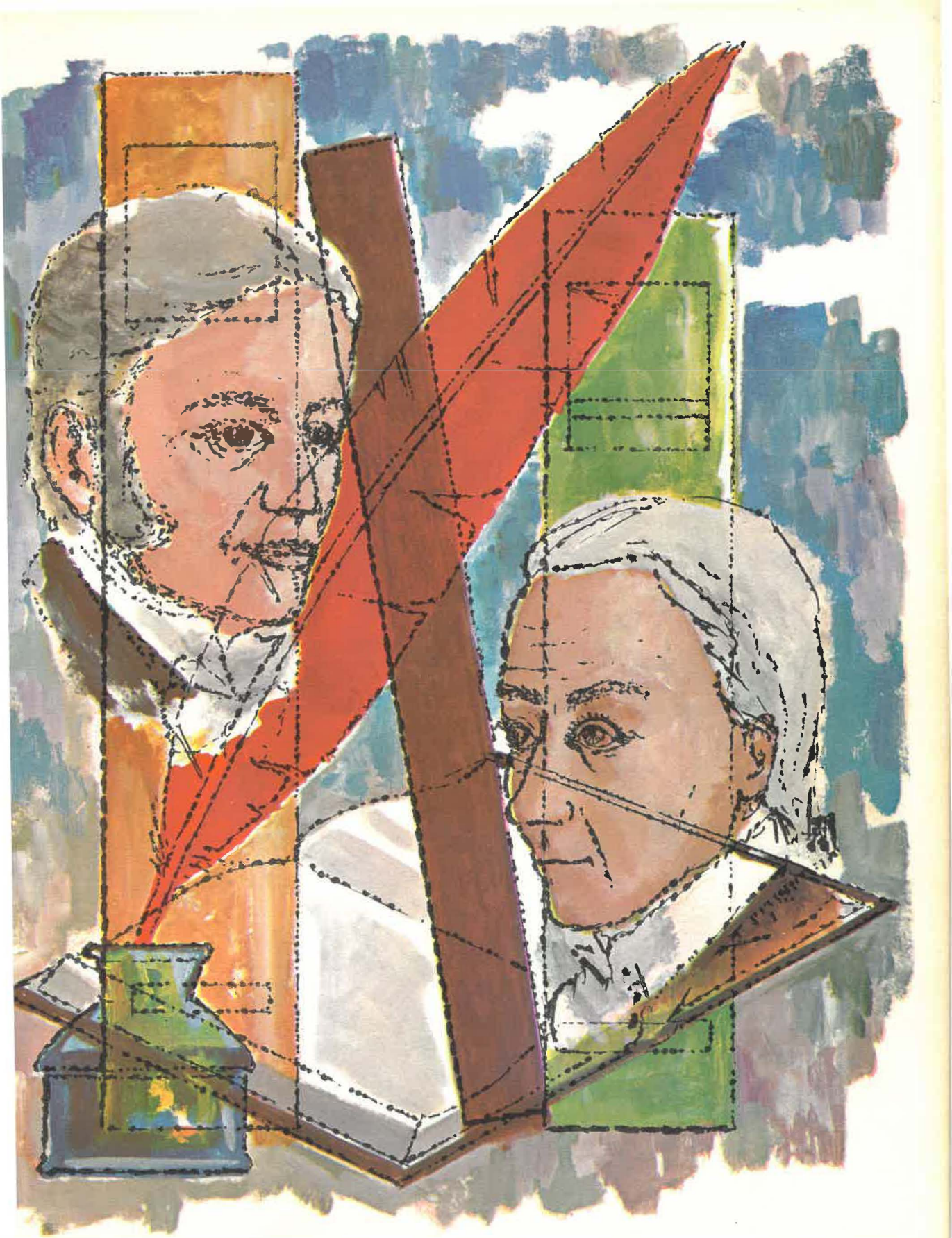

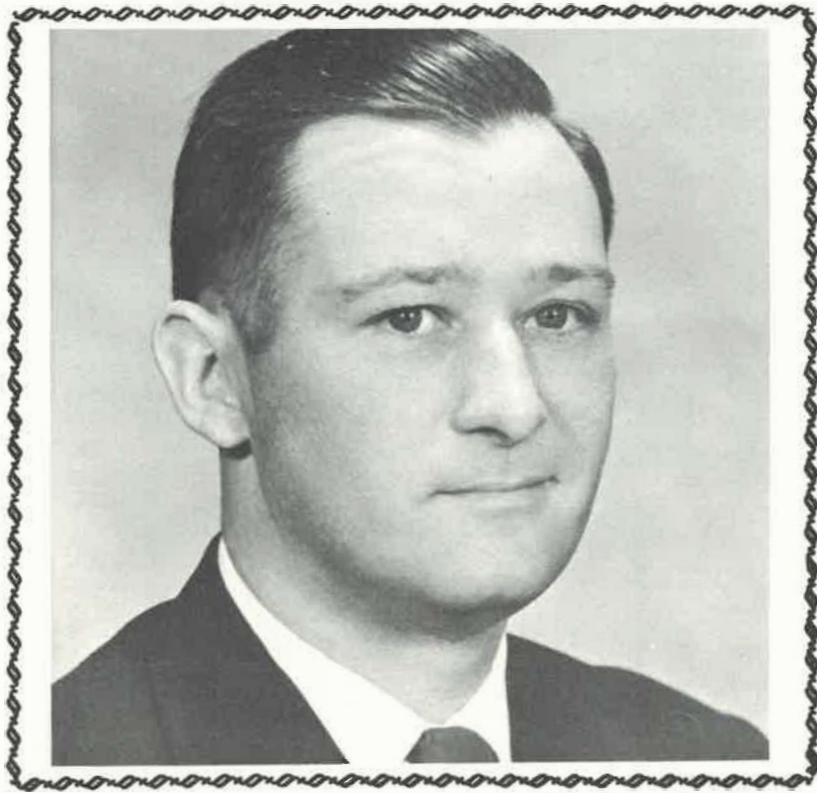

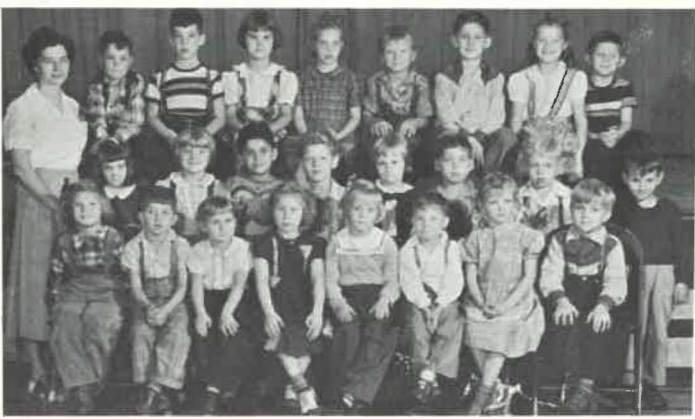

Washington Trip

At 5:15 on a cold, still dark Wednesday morning, October 25, 1961, the twenty-five jubilant Seniors, the class of 1962, and two chaperones, Mr. DeSantis and Mrs. Stetka boarded Short Line Bus 222 and began their much-anticipated trip to Washington D. C. Before the actual departure, there were the usual customs inspection, loading of baggage, and last minute goodbyes to friends and relatives. Wild excitement and jubilation diminished to a low roar as our speedy bus entered Scranton where all ate a hasty breakfast. Here, our guide, Mr. Weiss, who was to accompany us during the next four days, joined the group.

We lunched at the Bellevue Stratford Hotel in Philadelphia (the stew was salty, but we devoured it anyway). After a tour of Independence Hall we continued toward our eventual destination—the nations capitol.

Our excitement was greatly increased when Dave announced that a stop would be made at Annapolis, Maryland where we would witness a full-dress color parade of the cadets of the Naval Academy.

We arrived in Washington shortly after five o'clock---weary, sleepy, and disheveled, but with our excitement undiminished.

Upon arrival at the Annapolis Hotel we scurried to the registration desk for our room keys. The poor desk clerk, seeing the twenty-five of us alight on his calm corner, turned a bright shade of green.

After considerable confusion we were settled in our beautiful rooms, where we made frantic preparations for the coming evening's activities.



The Lotus Club served us a surprise meal—a surprise because it was too dark to see what we were eating! The remainder of the evening was spent writing post cards, eating hamburgers and gabbing till the dawn of our second day in Washington.

Thursday morning, after a quick breakfast we drooled at the Bureau of Printing and Engraving, toured Arlington Cemetery and the Tomb of the Unknowns, and snapped pictures of the Iwo Jima Statue. We took our faithful bus to Mt. Vernon, and before returning to the hotel for lunch, stopped at the Masonic Temple. The first thing we did that afternoon was to congregate at the capitol and have our class picture taken. Judy was assisted back to the bus by Mr. DeSantis. We then toured the capitol building, the F.B.I. Building, and rushed home to the hotel for supper. The evening was ours to spend as we wished.

Friday morning we crawled to breakfast after being summoned by an altogether too cheery operator. The morning was spent taking guided tours through the Franciscan Monastery and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. After lunch we walked (I repeat walked!) up the entire height of the Washington Monument. The rest of the afternoon was spent recuperating at the Museum of Natural History, and the Smithsonian Institute, and the Art Gallery. Supper was followed by a tour of the National Archives and an impressive trip to the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials. We spent over an hour at the Washington Airport watching innumerable planes land and take off, browsing through the many gift shops and buying enormous quantities of post cards.

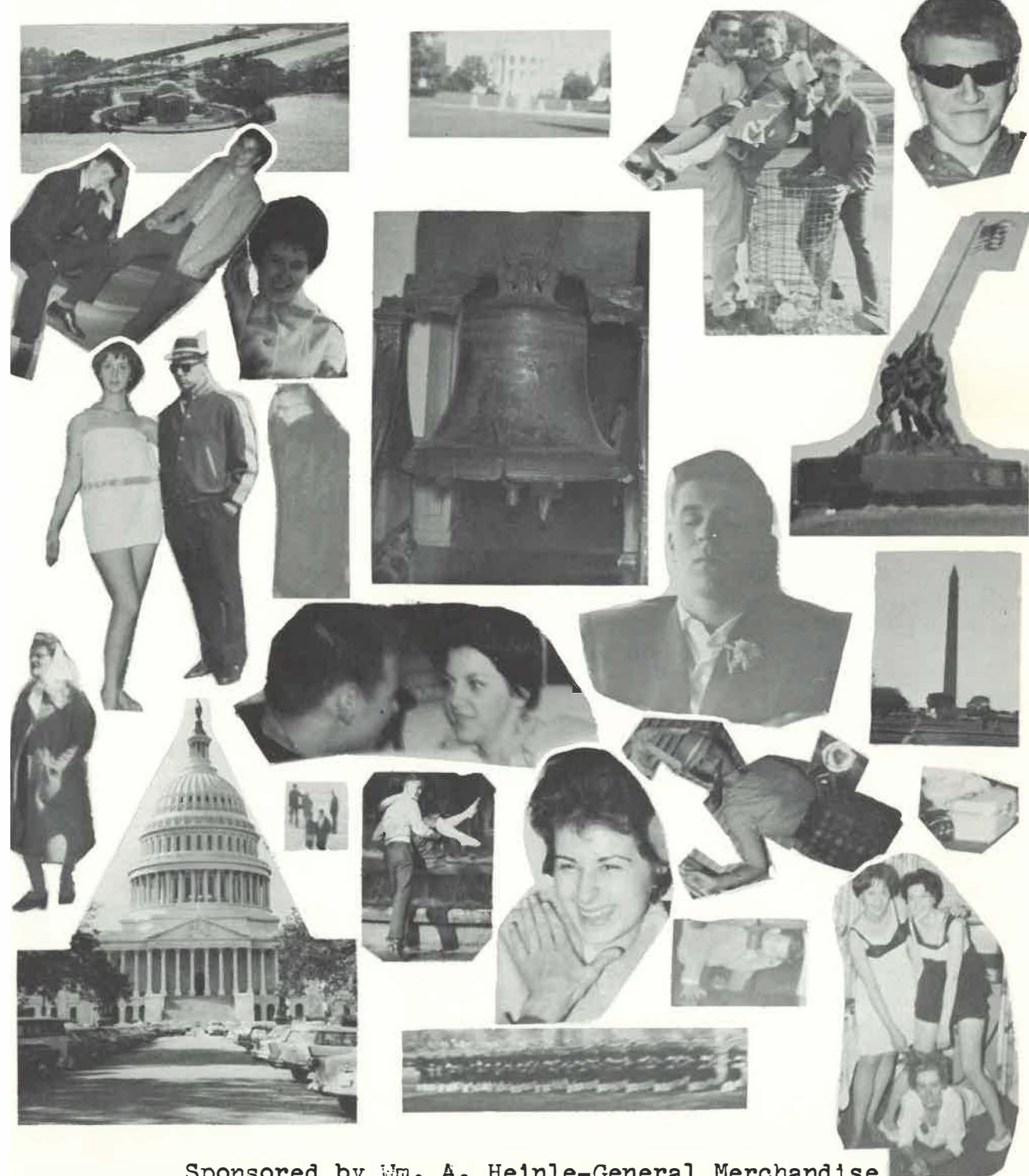
