Here, our guide, Mr. Welss, who was to accompany us during the next four days, joined the group.

We lunched at the Bellevue Stratford Hotel in Philadelphia(the stew was salty, but we devoured it anyway). After a tour of Independence Hall we continued toward our eventual destination-the nations cap1tol.

Our excitement was greatly increased when Dave announced that a stop would be made at Annopolis, Maryland where we would witness a full-dress color parade of the cadets of the Naval Academy.

We took our falthful bus to Mt. Vernon, and before returiling to the hotel for lunch, stopped at the Masonic Temple. The first thing we did that afternoon was to congregate at the capitol and have our class picture taken. Judy was assisted back to the bus by Mr. DeSantis. We then toured the capitol building, the F.B.I. Building, and rushed home to the hotel for supper. The evening was ours to spend as we wished.

The morning was spent taking guided tours through the Franciscan Monastery and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. After lunch,our last meal at the hotel-last minute dressing and packing kept us busy until our bus finally arrived for the trip home.

Before leaving the capitol city we took our last tour, that of the Washington Cathedral. We enjoyed an excellent dinner at the Gettysburg Hotel, and were shown

Shortly after 9:00, Saturday light we reached Narrowsburg. Relatives and friends were igain gathered in front of N.H.S.
