# Washington Trip

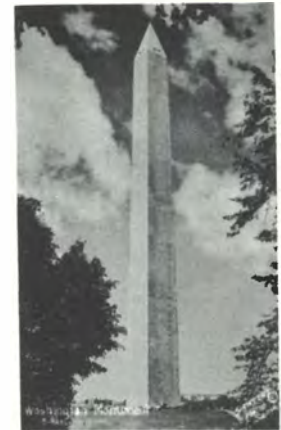

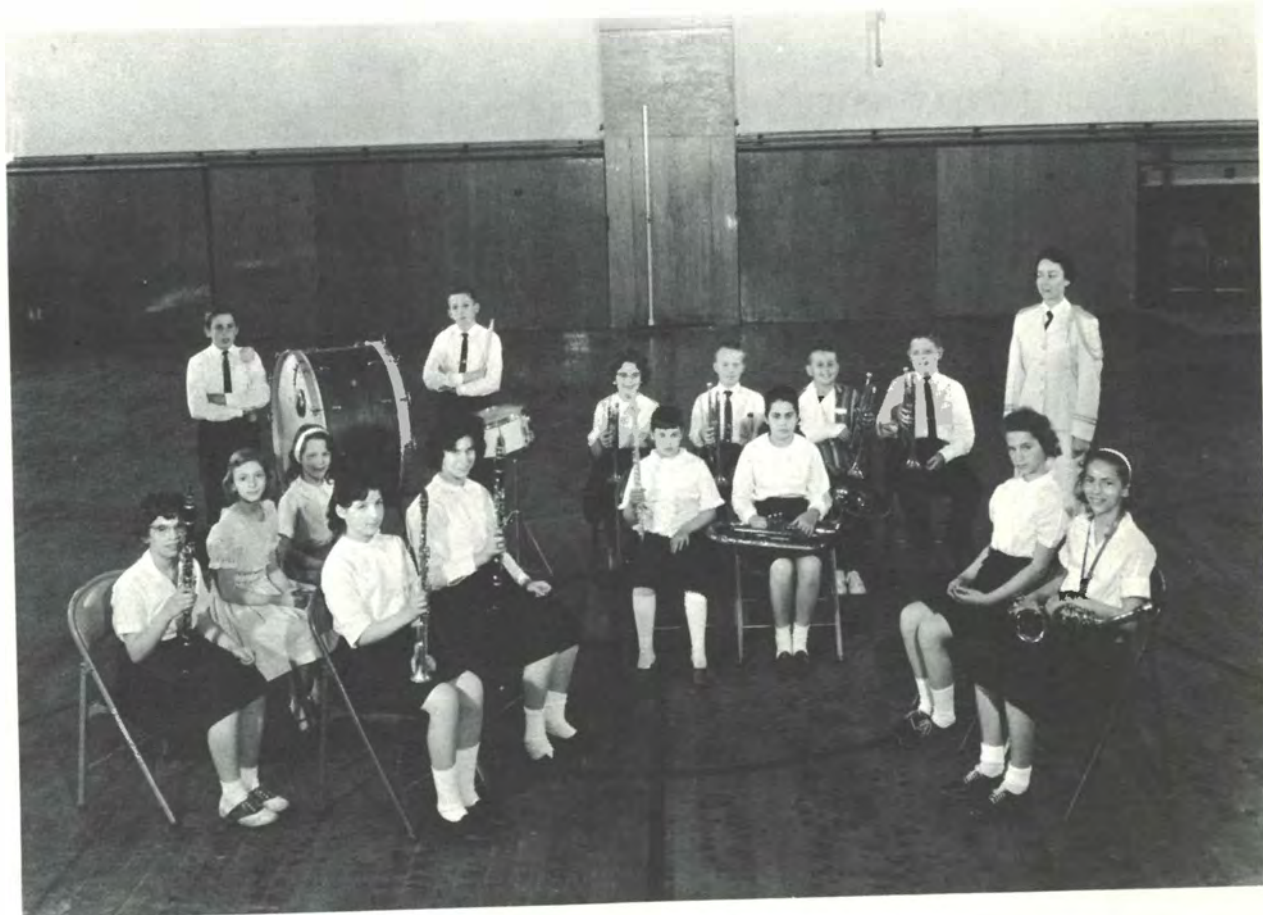
