

Of our banner Blue and Gold.



At last came our Junior year and we all looked forward to that year's activities. That same fall, we welcomed John Condello, who joined our class from Brooklyn Prep. High School.

Our first activity, held in October of '62, was a New England Boiled Dinner, which proved a dismal failure.

No one will ever forget the enormous worm that squirmed and wound its way through town, filled with ambitious Juniors. However, this unorthodox advertising could not counteract the snow storm we had on play-night. There was only a small turnout, but the play was well received by those present.

The last of our fund raising activities was the Junior Prom, which was entitled "Somewhere Over The Rainbow". Doreen Prendergast and Ed Hulihan reigned as Queen and King. We danced to Ray Shaara's music while a huge crystal ball refracted beautifully colored light

throughout the gymnasium.

We were proud of the six Honor Society members chosen from our class during our Junior year. They were Cathy Brock, Nick Dale, Alexis Dailey, Linda Hazard,

Pat Preis, and Fran Valenti.



The class began diligent work on the yearbook in November - a task which has kept us busy for the major portion of our Senior year. We are grateful to Mr. Burke, our yearbook advisor, for taking us over many hurdles and for helping to make the "Chieftain" a success.

Graduation is next and last in our line of Senior activities. It is with mixed emotions that we leave our Alma Mater, our teachers, and our friends. We would like to take this final opportunity to thank those who have helped make our high school careers a success and who have laid down for us a solid foundation for the future.



George Schluer - Former Seaman First Class George Schluer is presently serving time in the brig for speed-shifting a submarine.


<u>Pete</u> <u>Stetka</u> - Pete has put his engineering training to good use by tunneling a passage between the boys' and the girls' dorms at his college.

At dinner next day I began relating with zeal, Until I saw the main course Guess what - it was v-e-a-1.




















A great many improvements have been brought about through the suggestions of the Student Council. The aim of this group is to better the school - their function is to serve the students.
