
#### MR. SULLIVAN, PRINCIPAL


It is a very helpful club for teachers and students alike making many fine films available for viewing.

get two years of up-to-date training in the office field. The lower right hand picture is of Mr. Schwalbenberg, Executive Director of






It is hoped that in the future the Vocational School Program will expand to enhance many other occupations, including Electrical Repairs, Conservation, and Ornamental Horticulture.
