

You have a responsibility to yourself in the career you will assume to control situations as best you can, and conduct yourselves in a civilized manner regardless of what others may do.

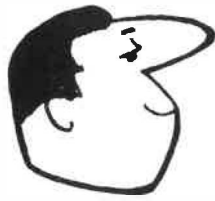

Mrs. Henke is doing a great job as our band and Glee Club director, and so is Mrs. Daub with the Stamp Club. We are very proud of both of them.



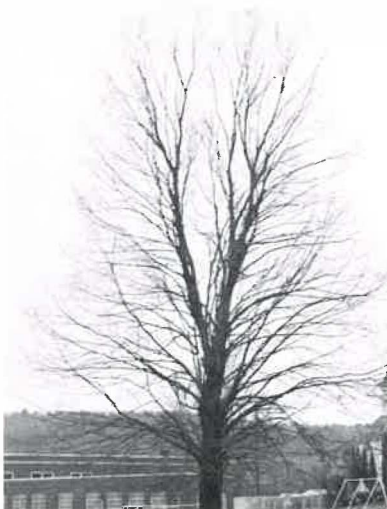
