Although you deserve much more recognition that we have given you, we, the 1989 senior class say "Thank you."



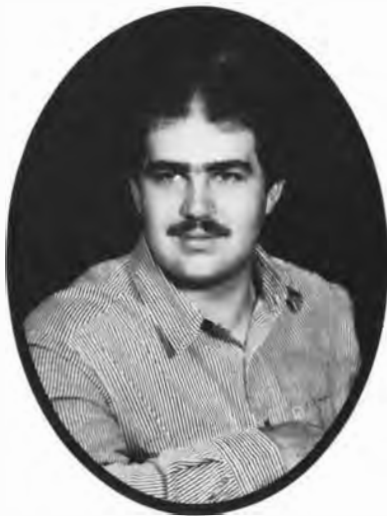

Like Emerson, Mrs. Rovitz promotes thinking things out in your own mind instead of accepting what others have written or said. When remembering English class, we'll remember long stimulating discussions that generally were based upon a novel or a play. She taught us that success isn't about material possessions through F. Scott Fitzgerald's novel *The Great Gatsby* and Arthur Miller's play *Death of a Salesman* and that power doesn't directly influence one's happiness through two of Shakespeare's plays *Julius Caesar* and *Macbeth*.

So now, we, the seniors, are at the end of one act. Somehow, like Mark Twain's *Huckleberry Finn*, we have grown from our experiences and attribute this to Mrs. Rovitz's ability to challenge us and tap into our creativity. Although we wouldn't admit it right now, if we had to do it all over again we would. "... because if I'd a knowed what a trouble it was to make a book I wouldn't a tackled it and ain't agoing to no more. But I reckon I got to light out for the Territory ahead of the rest, because Aunt Sally she's going to adopt me and civilize me and I can't stand it. I been there before."
